Scandinavian Astor Group has verified its sustainability statement according to SIS/TS 2:2025 to SS-EN ISO 26000:2021, according to SIS/TS 3:2025, on February 2, 2026, which demonstrates the organization's social responsibility to maximize the contribution to sustainable development.

The credibility of the sustainability statement and the correspondence with real conditions have been verified by VERIFY Agency of Sweden AB with accreditation number 10482 and is accredited by Swedac for verification according to ISO/IEC 17029:2019.

The sustainability statement consists of the management statement and the organization's answers to the questions in SIS/TS 2:2025, based on SS-EN ISO 26000:2021 Organizational social responsibility - Guidance.

The scope of this verification concerns the entire Scandinavian Astor Group AB group structure, which includes the parent company and all wholly owned subsidiaries within the business areas Astor Tech, Astor Industry and Astor Protect.

Assessment and statement

Scandinavian Astor Group AB is a technology-driven defense and security group that develops, manufactures, and delivers advanced solutions for defense, security, and industrial customers. The group's core processes include everything from product development and technical design to high-precision production, quality assurance and long-term customer relationships - primarily with government agencies and international players. The business model is based on a combination of organic growth and strategic acquisitions, with the parent company responsible for group-wide functions and subsidiaries handling operational activities and ESG work.

The verification process confirms that Scandinavian Astor Group has a clear ambition to integrate sustainability into its governance. The work is well-established in both management and the board. By following the principles of ISO 26000, prioritized sustainability issues are directly linked to the business model, risk profile, and value chain. At the same time, several of the Group's subsidiaries are also certified according to ISO 9001 and ISO 14001.

In 2025, Scandinavian Astor Group systematized its sustainability work through a dual materiality analysis and new common governance principles. With a concrete action plan for 2026, the operations are now more clearly linked to the CSRD requirements and the UN's global goals. The Group has demonstrated a high level of transparency in its sustainability declaration and supported its responses with relevant documentation. Based on a stakeholder and materiality analysis, the Group has selected specific sub-goals from the UN's Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs), which have been compiled into an action plan. This is supplemented by a business plan with an external SWOT analysis. Social responsibility is regulated through clear personnel and work environment policies. In the environmental area, several subsidiaries are actively implementing ISO 14001, and a group-wide plan to collect environmental data has been initiated. A concrete example is the introduction of a fund for air travel to reduce the climate impact of business travel. Circularity is addressed through careful material and supplier reviews, as well as sustainability requirements in procurement. organisation refers to in the sustainability declaration and in the management of its sustainability work, such as policies, business plans, meeting planning, analyses, assessments, protocols, surveys, communication efforts and training. A site audit has also been carried out.
